

In June of 1955, the Architectural Press published a special issue called Outrage, edited by Ian Nairn. As one of Britain's most famously opinionated (and untrained) architectural critics, it came as no surprise that the issue opened with a prophecy of doom: 'that if what is called development is allowed to multiply at the present rate', then all can be expected is the subsequent loss of the individuality and spirit of Britain's natural, and urban, landscapes. Nairn coined this phenomenon 'Subtopia' and demonstrates it, throughout the issue, with mugshots of offending lampposts, arterial roads and garrotted trees.

Ian Nairn (1930–1983) was a British architectural critic and topographer.

For many years, photographer Michael Collins had wondered what exactly it was that he found so mysterious about photography. Since her untimely death in 1973, Ingeborg Bachmann has come to be regarded as one of the twentieth century's most important Germanlanguage writers. Unpacking a single Bachmann poem, Tom McCarthy latches onto two of its central terms the eponymous threshold and ledger - and takes off on a line of flight that carries the reader through the work of Franz Kafka, David Lynch, Anne Carson, Sappho and Shakespeare. Can writing be understood as an experience of the threshold, a limit- or boundarystate? A condition of ecstasy or ecstasis, standing outside of oneself? If so, then how might such experience be archived, jotted down, notated? And when the boundaries of the self are ruptured, who then might be said to be this ledger's author?

Tom McCarthy is a novelist whose work has been translated into more than twenty languages and adapted for cinema, theatre and radio. He won the inaugural Windham-Campbell Prize for Fiction, and two of his novels were Booker Prize finalists. He has held Visiting Professorships at the Royal College of Art London, Columbia University New York and Städelschule Frankfurt. He lives in Berlin.

Over the past few decades, there has been a remarkable rise in the number of people who speak publicly about their experience of crime: bookshops heave with autobiographies by prisoners; Netflix and YouTube host interviews with serial killers and true-crime podcasts like *Criminal* often feature episodes focusing entirely on one person's narrative.

In this fascinating new book, British criminologist Jennifer Fleetwood examines a number of well-known 'crimes' which are known to us via a public, first-person account to try to make sense of the social. political and cultural consequences that this confessional impulse has on our lives. From Prince Andrew's disastrous Newsnight interview to the backlash that resulted from 'ISIS bride' Shamima Begum's 2019 testimony in The Times, Fleetwood shows us what really happens when we tell stories about crime and who benefits from all this storytelling.

Jennifer Fleetwood is a Senior Lecturer in Criminology at the University of Goldsmiths, London.



Johnson draws on interviews with the members of the orchestra who performed Shostakovich's *Leningrad Symphony* at the time of the siege of Leningrad, during which almost a third of the population starved to death. In the end, this book is a reaffirmation of a kind of humanist miracle: that hope could be reborn in a time when, to quote the writer Nadezhda Mandelstam, there was only 'Hope against Hope'.
